The actual amounts budgeted, as well as the amounts spent, for each purpose and in aggregate, likely will vary from one fiscal year to the next depending on the realized tax collections and the needs of the Preston County School District, as determined by The Board of Education of the County of Preston with respect to each fiscal year. If the amounts budgeted by The Board of Education of the County of Preston for a specific purpose or purposes for a fiscal year are not able to be spent entirely in such fiscal year, then the unspent amounts may be carried over and spent on such specific purpose or purposes in subsequent fiscal years.

In that event, the levy rate shall be reduced so as to cause such rate to produce no more than one hundred and four percent from all classes of property, excluding appraisal or valuation from new construction or improvements to existing real property, including beginning recovery of natural resources and newly acquired personal property, of the previous year's projected property tax revenues from all property.	
	In the event that the amount collected is less than the amounts noted for the above purposes for any one or more fiscal years, The Board of Education of the County of Preston shall determine, in its discretion, which one or more of the enumerated purposes set forth above shall be reduced for each such fiscal year, and the amount of each such reduction for such fiscal year, provided that the total of all such reductions shall not exceed the amount of such collection shortfall for such fiscal year.
