			The Board of Education of the County of Preston is hereby authorized and empowered to expend, during the term of this levy, the surplus, if any, accruing in excess of the above amounts needed for any of the above-stated purposes, plus excess collections due to increased assessed valuations for the enrichment, supplementation, operation and improvement of educational services and/or facilities in the public schools of the County of Preston. The actual amounts budgeted, as well as the amounts spent, for each purpose and in aggregate, likely will vary from one fiscal year to the next depending on the realized tax collections and the needs of the Preston County School District, as determined by The Board of Education of the County of Preston with respect to each fiscal year. If the amounts budgeted by The Board of Education of the County of Preston for a specific purpose or purposes for a fiscal year are not able to be spent entirely in such fiscal year, then the unspent amounts may be carried over and spent on such specific purpose or purposes in subsequent fiscal years.
			The Board of Education of the County of Preston reserves unto itself as the levying body the right and authority to reduce the rates of the excess levy, should increase assessments produce funds beyond projected needs in any year specified in the levy call in accordance with section six-g, article eight, chapter eleven, of the West Virginia Code.
			For each fiscal year beginning on and after July 1, 2025, The Board of Education of the County of Preston shall reduce the levy rates proportionately for all classes of property when increased assessed valuations, excluding appraisal or valuation due to new construction or improvements to existing real property, including beginning recovery of natural resources and newly acquired personal property, would cause an increase of more than four percent in the total projected property tax revenues from the previous year's projected property tax revenues. In that event, the levy rate shall be reduced so as to cause such rate to produce no more than one hundred and four percent from all classes of property, excluding appraisal or valuation from new construction or improvements to existing real property, including beginning recovery of natural resources and newly acquired personal property, of the previous year's projected property tax revenues from all property.
			In the event that the amount collected is less than the amounts noted for the above purposes for any one or more fiscal years, The Board of Education of the County of Preston shall determine, in its discretion, which one or more of the enumerated purposes set forth above shall be reduced for each such fiscal year, and the amount of each such reduction for such fiscal year, provided that the total of all such reductions shall not exceed the amount of such collection shortfall for such fiscal year.
			In the event The Board of Education of the County of Preston shall obtain additional money, by grant or otherwise, from the state or federal government, or from any agency of either, or from any other source, for the purposes aforesaid, such additional money may be used either in substitution for, or in addition to, the sums obtained from such additional levies as said The Board of Education of the County of Preston may from time to time determine. The additional levies, per each one hundred dollars in value, shall be on Class I property, 9.34¢; on Class II property, 18.68¢; on Class III property, 37.36¢; and, on Class IV property, 37.36¢.
